



FOR PASTORAL CARE

If anyone becomes seriously ill, is hospitalized, is planning to have surgery, or otherwise wishes pastoral care, please call the church office (732-477-5533). In case of emergency or if death seems imminent, call the office first, and if no one is there, please call the emergency number, which is included on the answering machine message.

In case of a death in the family, please make your first call to the church or pastor, and then to a funeral home of your choice for removal of the body. Especially in a time of crisis like this, your pastors stand ready for immediate ministry with you. It does not matter if your deceased family member was a member of St. Thomas or not. It only matters that your church wants to be with you in the time of your loss. We will be available to you for planning an appropriate service of worship, which serves as an important farewell to your loved one, a celebration of his or her life, and which brings the Good News of resurrection through Christ.



It is important to us that our shut-in members are included in the life of our congregation and we want to make sure that they receive Holy Communion. Sometimes people become shut-in and we are unaware. If you are a shut-in or are aware of someone who is also shut-in and are not being visited, please contact the church office (732-477-5533) so that the pastors and members of our visitation team can visit with you and bring you the sacrament.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last month we got to thinking about why our newsletter is called "The Vine and Branches." Have you ever wondered about that? Where does that name come from? In gospel of John, Jesus says, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:6)



Jesus speaks these words as he prepares to enter the Garden of Gethsemane and ultimately face his death on the cross. In these, some of his final words to his disciples, Jesus is reminding them that they must depend on him. This passage has to do with the disciples' relationship with Jesus, connectedness to him, and how they will be sustained and grow as they move forward.

Even the most awful of gardeners know what happens when a branch is severed from a tree or plant; that branch will die because it no longer receives nutrients from the plant. The same can be said for us. We must be connected to Jesus in order to bear fruit (e.g. serve one another) and to be faithful followers.

So, our newsletter, "The Vine and Branches," helps to keep us, branches, connected to Jesus, the vine. "The Vine and Branches" includes articles, information about upcoming events and worship opportunities, thoughts about stewardship, opportunities for service, etc. All of these things are intended to nurture our faith and to help us to stay connected to Jesus, the vine, and to the community of faith which also helps to nurture our growth as disciples.

PIANO BUILDER'S CORNER

The Piano Builders remain on their Thursday and plus schedule as needed. We cleared out the street drain as best we could and kept the water flowing. When we have heavy rains there will be ponding water but it will still drain and eventually clear up. Scott installed several now required CO2 detectors. Prior to the Fire inspection we checked all the exit lights and replaced several burnt-out bulbs. One of our new tasks will be to put any gym tables away as Soccer Shots uses the gym at night. With Christmas over we took the trees apart, threw out the old ones, took down all the wreaths, and put away all the decorations. I found a gouge in a gym floor tile so I cleaned it up and put some floor cement in the hole and will see how it holds up. The Board of Health has required us to install a separate hand washing sink in the kitchen, so we had a plumber install the rough plumbing and we finished the installation. We also installed a outside locked mailbox unit for mail delivery when the office is closed. I think Lenny got a kick out of using my hammer drill. Since the start of the new year Lee Irwin has joined our group and has also helped the food pantry as needed.

There are many small projects that require attention and as usual we look for and find those things that should be improved. We can still use any additional help; even if you can only occasionally join us, your presence would be welcomed. Anyone interested just speak to one of the builders: Scott Long, Lenny Cubelo, John Sutton, or Tony Blanken. If you're not sure who any of us are, just drop a note in Scott Long's mailbox in the hallway.

Do something special this Lent: help fight hunger one day at a time! Place one non-perishable food item into a box each day during Lent (40 days = 40 items). **Return the box** and its contents to St. Thomas by Palm Sunday, April 14.

All items will be blessed during worship (on April 14) and will be used to stock the shelves of the St. Thomas Food Pantry.

Here are some suggested items:

tuna fish, macaroni and cheese, 2lb bags of rice, peanut butter, jelly, canned fruit, jello, pudding, toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.), soap, shampoo, lotion, toilet paper, paper towels, granola type bars, cereal, oatmeal/grits/oat bran, powdered milk, evaporated milk, juice boxes, canned meat (spaghetti-o's, canned hams, corned beef hash), ketchup, mustard, mayo, canned potatoes, pet food.




"SOUPER" BOWL SUNDAY
